Minutes of the **Meeting of Kinnerley Parish Council** on **24**th **October 2022 Kinnerley Parish Hall**

- 1. Apologies for absence: Cllrs Lorna Baker, Maurice Jones.
- 2. **Declarations of interest and dispensations –** There were no declarations of interest and no requests for dispensation
- **Minutes of Council** Council unanimously approved the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 26th September 2022, for the Chairman to sign.
- 4. Public participation session

One member of the public spoke in favour of a planning application. One member of the public spoke about the need to continue to work together locally to influence key agencies in respect of reducing the risk of flooding.

 - a) Report from Unitary Councillor Cllr Vince Hunt (Shropshire Council) reported:
 - Shropshire Council (SC) car park charges to increase from 31st October
 - SC and partner organisations are setting up warm spaces for residents in response to the current cost of living crisis
 - Covid numbers continue to increase
 - b) Report from Clerk, to include action log To be taken as read noted, error correction, Mayfield Lane should read Vicarage Lane
 - c) Report back on any developments regarding flooding Cllr Charles Green reported:
 - the Maesbrook group and the Pentre group: We continue to make approaches to Melverley in order to see how things work there with the National Flood Forum and in getting access to multi-agency support. Although there is no immediate prospect of formal joint working, they do however want to keep close links with any groups that are formed within the Kinnerley parish
 - continue to follow up with Mike Adams of the EA/SVWMS regarding the catchment rainfall modelling
 - crowd reporter tool is still available on the SVWMS website for residents to note issues, and training in using the tool is still awaited, along with corrections to already noted errors

- Arup/Jacobs West Midlands Shrewsbury 87-page Initial Assessment dated 26 May 2021 is available and references the Environment Agency and River Severn Partnership reviewing the potential of providing interventions such as storage upstream on the River Severn to reduce pressure on the Severn and its adjacent communities in storm events. High-level feasibility assessments are ongoing, however initial findings suggest that the SVWMS has the potential to provide controlled reduction of water levels to such a degree as to provide a significant reduction in flood risk to a large number of properties along the River Severn, including those in the at-risk communities in parts of Shrewsbury
- Melverley Internal Drainage Board (MIDB): held a meeting on 19th October. The exceptionally dry weather has made maintenance work easier to get on with. Most of that work is routine, on a rotational basis, but some relatively major work has been done to remedy a slipping high-sided bank in the Weir Brook below Brookside by Finney's Caravan park. The Board also adopted a new Biodiversity Action Plan, as required.

- f) To consider and determine: The Kinnerley branch of Mothers' Union would like to establish an area of biodiversity in the old churchyard in St. Mary's Kinnerley. item withdrawn

- iv. Councillors expressed concerns about the lack of road markings at the Knockin Road (B4396)/Maesbrook Road (B4398) junction that had recently been re-surfaced, leading to risk of accident Cllr Hunt agreed to take the matter forward urgently
